S.I. Ballet makes 'Dreams' a reality

Company bows with impressive first program

Ellen Rubich Tharp has achieved what fainter hearts might have considered impossible. She has gathered a group of experienced ballet dancers from around the world and created a resident ballet company for Staten Island.

The Staten Island Ballet presented its premiere program in Haugen Hall at the Staten Island Academy in a "one night stand" on

The show sold out and at least 100 additional ardent ballet fans were turned away. The company is clearly an idea whose time has come. The program chosen for the evening was appropriately accessible. Titled "Dreams from the Ballets," it was comprised of selections based on Marius Petipa's classic works. "La Bayadere," "Don Quixote" and "The Nutrockers."

The steps were adapted by Ms. Tharp herself as well as by the highly esteemed dancer/choreographer Daniel Catanach. Although the evening began with a few technical mishaps (a wrong tape, a ballerina skidding on what was clearly a very difficult floor), ruffled tutus were quickly smoothed and the program was soon sailing along gracefully.

The evening was divided into two acts. In the first act, I was particularly impressed with June Chin who danced with terrific poise and is a marvelous turner. The material in this act was challenging with complicated foot and leg work, as well as floor patterns that required accuracy and care on what was an unusually small stage for dancing.

I hope Ms. Tharp will focus her sights on finding a stage to better accommodate her company next time. Ballet dancers are like birds. They long to move expansively, and the audience longs to see them soar. The stage at the Staten Island Academy felt more like a cage, and prevented the dancers from truly flying.

The second act seemed to cope with the space limitations more easily. Entirely based on "The Nutcracker," it was filled with energy, good humor and spectacular costumes. One variation after the next. from the Spanish to the Arabian to the Chinese, the costumes just got better and better. I admire Tharp's meticulous attention to these details and look forward to what that careful eye will bring to full productions in the future.

"The Snow Pas de Deux" in this section was well crafted and confidently performed by Susanna Organek and Carlos Fittante. "The Arabian Variation" was particularly well danced by Victoria Lebedeva who was a featured soloist of the Kirov Ballet until she relocated to New York last year.

A special treat was the exuberant trepak dance with the reubber-legged folkdancers, Eugene Berger and Valentin Polyakov. Edward Morand, a native Staten Islander, danced the Spanish and Harlequin variations with a spirit and enthusiasm that well conveyed his love of dance, as did his attentive partnering.

I have always enjoyed the "Waltz of the Flowers" from "The Nutcracker" and Catanach did a wonderful job of sweeping and spiraling the dancers through space in this one. The finale



roused the audience to an enthusiastic ovation. In fact, when Ms. Tharp came out on stage the house was brought to its feet, the appreciation was palpable. Members of the audience seemed to sense it was their evening, an important beginning that deserved hearty encouragement.

Ms. Tharp, a New Dorp resident, is hoping to reach a broad audiences and perform in schools, churches and nursing homes, as

weil as traditional performance spaces. If her intended audiences respond with even half of the enthusiasm felt on Saturday night, she will be doing very well.

I personally look forward to the company's expanded activities. With a better stage, expanded lighting potential (John Chorman and Mark Weissman did a fine job with what was available) and most of all, live music, the Staten Island Ballet could give the Island a cultural outlet that has certainly been missed. It'll be nice for us to have a home team.

Tanglewood Is Divided Over Moves By Ozawa

Gilbert Kalish's decision to resign as chairman of the faculty of the Tanglewood Music Center, the internationally esteemed summer training program for young musi-cians in Lenox, Mass., came after a year of turmoil on the job, and a month of soulsearching.

His decision, in a fiery resignation letter made public on Thursday, has brought into the open a simmering dispute between many on the center's blue-chip faculty and Seiji Ozawa, the renowned conductor of the Boston Symphony Orchestra, which sponsors the program.

In his letter to Mr. Ozawa, Mr. Kalish, a highly regarded pianist and teacher, accused the conductor of following a "seemingly premeditated agenda that made a mockery" of the faculty's efforts to meet his concerns about reforming aspects of the center's programs.

"You have excluded the most trusted, knowledgeable and long-serving members of your administrative and artistic team from your discussions and have cast doubt on the leadership of the entire artistic community of the Tanglewood Music Center," he wrote. "Furthermore, all of this has been

Only one of the original Russian recruits will dance when the Staten Island Ballet performs on Saturday at Kaye Playhouse at Hunter College, on 68th Street between Lexington and Park Avenues in Manhattan. 'Right now I'm really low on Russians," Ms. Tharp, who is not related to the choreographer Twyla Tharp, said. But they come and go and she knows they will return. "There is such a supply of them," her husband, Paul,

The dancers pouring by the score into the United States from Russia and the countries that once made up the Soviet Union are performing, teaching and even running companies, filling the ranks of troupes from New York to California and from Minnesota to Texas. They are not the first Russian dancers to immigrate, or even the most notable or gifted. Immersed in the traditions of czarist and Soviet classical ballet, they have much to give American ballet but also much to learn. What stands out about them is their number.

"The calls and videos are endless, endless," Martin Fredmann, director of the Colorado Ballet and a leading ballet Russophile, said with a groan that was not entirely unhappy. "And my dancers give me more videos and résumés. I have a big box marked 'Russians,'

The current westward flow of Russian dancers began in an atmosphere of relative relaxation in 1990, a year before the dissolution of the Soviet Union. "That was the first year Russian dancers could sign contracts," said Eldar Aliev, a former member of the Kirov Ballet who now directs Ballet Internationale of Indianapolis. "Before that, we belonged to the company." Now there were choices, Mr. Aliev said, though they often had to be fought for. From early in this century,
