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


FEATURED CVCHIP ACO BOARD MEMBER

Thelma Bland Watson has served as Executive Director of Senior Connections, The Capital Area Agency on Aging since 2002. Senior Connections, one of 25 Area Agencies on Aging, in the Commonwealth of Virginia, is based in Richmond. She previously served as Assistant Executive Director of the Crater District Area Agency on Aging in Petersburg and served in several capacities with the Crater Planning District Commission. Senior Connections is a private (501c3), nonprofit organization that provides opportunities to improve the overall quality of life and health for seniors and their families, especially caregivers. The organization provides a range of home and community based services for seniors (older adults), persons with disabilities and caregivers to help eliminate isolation. Senior Connections partnered with the United Way of Greater Richmond & Petersburg to develop the Region's first Age Wave Readiness Plan with a focus on promoting diversity and creating livable communities for all ages. Senior Connections is partnering with the Department of Gerontology at Virginia Commonwealth University to implement key components of the Age Wave Readiness Plan.

Dr. Watson is a former Commissioner and Deputy Commissioner of Aging for the Commonwealth of Virginia, Department for the Aging (now a part of the Virginia Department for Aging and Rehabilitative Services). She also served as Executive Director of Field Services for the National Committee on Social Security and Medicare in Washington, D.C. from 1997 to 2002. She currently serves on leadership Boards for the Virginia Association of Area Agencies on Aging (V4A)-President, the Capital Area Workforce Investment Board, an inaugural member of the Central Virginia Coalition of Healthcare Providers (an Accountable Care Organization) and the Virginia Legal Services Corporation. Dr. Watson served on the Steering Committees for the 2016 and 2017 Virginia Governor's Conferences on Aging. In 2015, the Age Wave Initiative received the Valentine History Makers Award and Dr. Watson received the Humanitarian Award from the Virginia Center for Inclusive Communities. Dr. Watson also has been instrumental in implementing the No Wrong Door Service Coordination Program in Virginia. She also received recognition from the Richmond Times Dispatch in 2019 as a Person of the Year.

Dr. Watson received her undergraduate degree from Virginia State University (VSU) in Sociology with a concentration in Social Work. She received a graduate degree in Gerontology and a Doctorate in Public Policy and Administration from Virginia Commonwealth University (VCU). She also received certifications from the Virginia Executive Institute and the National Long-Term Care Institute. Dr. Watson has more than 30 years experience in nonprofit leadership, health care management and service delivery for older adults and caregivers.

LEANING ON TELEHEALTH OFFERS SOME RELIEF TO HOLDING ON TO PATIENTS AND OBTAINING REPLACEMENT INCOME DURING AND POST COVID-19

Under the Coronavirus Preparedness Supplemental and Response Appropriations Act and Section 1135 authority, the Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS) broadened to Medicare access TELEHEALTH services, so beneficiaries can get a wider range of services from their doctors and other clinicians without traveling to a health care facility. On March 6, 2020, Medicare began temporarily paying clinicians to furnish beneficiary TELEHEALTH services residing across the entire country.

Rebecca Etz, Ph.D., is a cultural anthropologist who recently joined the family medicine department. That may sound an odd match, but it fits Etz perfectly. "In college, I always imagined I'd be a family doctor," she says. To learn more, she shadowed general practitioners, but found the reality did not match her expectations. She gravitated to anthropology, getting her Ph.D. at Rutgers.

Next, she took a postdoctoral fellowship at the Robert Wood Johnson Medical School and did research, from the vantage point of an anthropologist, on primary care practice. From that experience, she emerged with two driving motivations: cultural anthropology has a lot to offer primary care practitioners, and current primary care practice does not yet do enough to integrate mental and behavioral health. "For my career to have meaning, I'd like to help figure out how to have medical records give voice to patient concerns and to foster everyday integration of mental and behavioral health into primary care practice," said Etz.
