YELLOW LINE AT HUNTINGTON TO CLOSE THROUGH SUMMER

WMATA, which operates Metrorail, has announced that all stations south of the Ronald Reagan National Airport Station will be closed between Memorial Day and Labor Day 2019.

The extended closure is to address long-standing and extensive repairs needed for the continued safe operation of three outdoor station platforms.

Single-tracking and temporary work were considered but estimated to extend the repair timeline to several years. The Metro Board chose instead to enact the temporary closure.

Free shuttle service is planned, but no doubt, the service suspension will have a pronounced impact on our region.

WMATA also announced that the Huntington Metrorail Station South Parking Garage on North Kings Highway, parts of which are already closed, will be closed indefinitely pending a decision on a major renovation or construction of a new garage. While WMATA information is sparse, they are supposed to provide "enhanced parking" to compensate for the loss of existing parking.

Reportedly WMATA is considering commercial development above Metrorail stations, but it is not yet known whether that is a possibility. This closure coincides with the closure of the Yellow Line this summer. The parking structure is scheduled for demolition in 2019.

SPEED BUMPS ON SHENANDOAH?

In case you have seen new spray paint along different sections on Shenandoah Road, those are markings where proposed speed humps would go. There is a second initiative underway by a group of Hollin Hall neighbors to have the bumps placed along the road to slow down traffic. As this initiative moves through the county process, stay tuned for additional updates and a community awareness meeting to discuss the traffic calming effort.

STORMWATER 101

Our own HHV weather station (on the Weather Underground site) shows over 10 inches of precipitation fell here between December 1 and February 28.

Recent abnormal precipitation - 2018 totals set a new record - has produced a recent spate of Nextdoor postings from HHV neighbors about flooded basements and crawl spaces. And more recently it has affected our streets.

Getting rid of the storm water before it gets into your home is an integrated process. It starts at your home's gutters/downspouts channeling water to the VDOT maintained storm drains and ditches lining our streets.

Once it gets into the VDOT system it flows into our local streams and creeks. If these conveyances aren't functioning the result is wet basements, soggy yards and flooded roads.

HHV got a first-hand look at this problem last month at the corner of Wellington and Baltimore. Named "Lake Baltimore" by nearby neighbors, storm water covered both



roads at the intersection. As of today, it looks like VDOT fixed that problem, but the question is what to do if it happens again on your street.

But first a word about prevention; if the gutters or ditches along your street have an accumulation of debris - leaves, branches, litter - take a minute to pick it up and put it in the trash. And don't put yard debris along the curb or rake it into the storm drain opening.

If you see a water issue developing on your street, you want to contact VDOT immediately. VDOT has an on-line reporting page that is easy to use and typically results in an immediate response, as well as reports as work progress. <u>my.vdot.virginia.gov</u> | 1-800-367-7623
