Furthermore, they reinterpret provisions of the Equality Act 2010 as if the protected characteristic of 'gender reassignment' were actually 'gender identity' – something Parliament chose explicitly not to permit. This new Stonewall income earner is due to be launched in February. I believe that you will wish to instruct Stonewall, who act as Education Department most senior advisers and are paid by a large number of government departments and institutions to follow the laws and official guidelines; rather than to market materials for schools which directly contravene these.

Indeed, it is surely astonishing to learn that this proposal has slipped through the undoubtedly strong net of Child Protection that our government has firmly put in place.

I hope that you will see fit to stop this latest effort at thwarting the DfE's excellent work in favour of untimely materials from an outside organisation.
