The Pastor's Corner

Greetings from First Baptist Church! I hope I can be an encouragement to you today. Let's try to take the good and the bad together, not taking for granted the former, and not grumbling about the latter. In spite of all, let us learn to say with Job, "The LORD gave and the LORD has taken away. Blessed be the name of the LORD" (1:21, NASB). You might be thinking, "Easy for Job to say, he didn't have a pandemic, social distancing, and social unrest to deal with." You're right. He didn't have to deal with what we have to deal with. He had it worse. Job had Satan himself harassing him (with God's permission!). One bad day, Satan was allowed to persecute Job. That day his seven sons died. His three daughters died. His servants died. His 7,000 sheep, 3,000 camels, 500 yoke of oxen, and 500 female donkeys all died (Job 1:2-3). And then, if you keep reading past Job chapter one, things got even worse as Job's health bottomed out badly. To make matters worse still, Job's three obnoxious friends opposed him, saying he was sick because he sinned. Job rose to the occasion, and the battle was on.

I'm guessing Job didn't have access to Psalm 135. It would have greatly helped him. Since we do have access to it, let's explore a bit to see and hear what the Lord has to say by way of encouragement. Among other things, Psalm 135 answers five questions: 1) What does God do? 2) What do we need to do? 3) What is God's character and essence like? 4) What is the expiration date for God's name and fame? and 5) How does the Lord see us? We will look at each of these in order. (This will be selective, not comprehensive, due to limitations of space, time, and purpose.)

1) What does God do? Verse 4 says that God chooses people. We see in verse 7 that the Lord controls the natural order, His creation. Namely, God "makes lightning" and "brings wind out of His treasures." From verse 9 we know that the Lord sends "signs and wonders." Oh, and backing up to verse 6 we read, "Whatever the Lord pleases He does." *Carte blanche*. The Lord answers to no one.

2) What do we need to do? Verse 1 indicates we need to "praise the name of the LORD." God doesn't need anything, so He doesn't need us to praise Him. But He commands that we do so, and blesses us when we do. It is our high honor to praise the holy name of the Lord. Verse 2 reminds us that we need to be in the house of the Lord. That's a little tricky these days, isn't it? Many reading this want to be in the Sunday services of their beloved churches, but still may not be able to do so for health or other reasons. You want to be there, but you cannot. King David wanted to build a house for the Lord. The Lord told David that it would not be him but his son, Solomon, who would build it. The Lord said to David, "You did well to have it in your heart to build a temple for my Name" (1 Kings 8:18). Same with you: you did well to have it in your heart to be in God's house these past Sundays, though you could not be there.

3) What is God's character and essence like? Verse 3 tells us that God is good. Amen! The evidence is everywhere. The Lord whispers His goodness while you enjoy dinner or lay down to sleep. He shouts His goodness through the glorious sunrises and sunsets that we see. Verse 5 bears witness that God is not only good, but "the LORD is great, and...above all gods." As Westminster says, "God is infinite, eternal, and unchangeable in His being, wisdom, power, holiness, justice, goodness, and truth." God's greatness is eternally His, and His alone. And then, God is not only good and great, but He is also the Blessed One (verse 21)!

4) What is the expiration date for God's name and fame? This is only going to get a little attention in this article. But I hope God's name and fame gets a lot of your attention in your heart and mind, starting now, continuing through eternity. Make it a memory verse: "Your name, O LORD, endures forever, Your fame, O LORD, throughout all generations" (Psalm 135:13, NKJV). Unlike the stuff in the back of your refrigerator, there is no expiration date on God's name and fame. Both are amazing, both belong uniquely to God alone, and both are forever.

5) How does the Lord see us? God's church is the people who believe savingly in Jesus' death, burial, and resurrection. He sees His people as *servants* (an exalted role, forever dignified by the Suffering Servant, Jesus Christ). God also sees us as *His special treasure*, and as *His house* (verses 1, 4, 14, 19).

So, there you have it. Some gleanings from Psalm 135. I hope it encourages you as only the scriptures can. May the LORD richly bless you and your loved ones!
