

VETERANS URGED TO CONTACT SENATORS

With controversy surrounding the War Memorial Bill (SB 620), members are urged to contact their State Senators to recommend specific action regarding the bill.

SB 620 basically calls for removal of "a prohibition on disturbing or interfering with any war monument or memorial erected by a locality or preventing citizens from maintaining such monument or memorial. The bill authorizes a locality to alter, move, or remove any monument or memorial from the locality's public property and removes certain criminal and civil penalties for such."

To view the full bill online, go to Virginia's Legislative Information System (LIS). Greg Eanes, President of the Virginia Veterans Memorial Preservation Foundation, urges Veterans to call for specific action: 1) let the war memorial bill die; 2) only the Senate version is acceptable but it needs improvement; or 3) table the bill to give the Joint Leadership Council of Veterans Service Organizations, in conjunction with the Virginia Department of Historic Resources, time to formally review and make its input on any war memorial removal legislation. One Veteran was accepted as a member in the Post during the monthly meeting March 13.

Dexter W. Dotson of Hillsville, a United States Air Force Veteran of Operation Desert Storm, has transferred in having previously been a "member at large."

With Dotson's addition to the rolls, Post 1115 now claims a total of 484 members for the current year, including 359 Life Members. This is 81.8 percent of the membership quota, which is 593.
